 - Scholarships funded: \$7.7 million



- Does ADF&G have concerns that the current permitting system does not adequately protect salmon?
 - No. The ADF&G believes the current permitting process effectively protects anadromous fish habitat. [page 2]
- Since all natural waterbodies would be considered anadromous, how much effort would be required for a site-specific determination to determine it is not anadromous?
 - In some cases, effort would be minimal if there is an obvious physical barrier to anadromous fish. In cases without an obvious barrier, proving anadromous fish are not present would be difficult, time consuming, and expensive. [page 2]
