Ontario Chamber of Commerce sends Letter to Minister of Foreign Affairs Emphasizing that a Strong Canada-U.S. Trade Relationship is Essential to our Shared Prosperity

Windsor, ON – Today the Ontario Chamber of Commerce Network wrote a letter to the Hon. Chrystia Freeland, Minister of Foreign Affairs, Government of Canada to emphasize the importance of the Canada-U.S. relationship moving into 2017 and beyond. International trade was a major focus of the 2016 presidential campaign.
