Modern ribbon-cutting ceremonies begin to appear in historical accounts at the end of the 19th century. According to Union Parish, La. Archives, a ribbon-cutting ceremony was held around 1898 for the opening of a railroad line in northern Louisiana. Prominent ribbon cuttings include the opening of the Disneyland Monorail in 1959 and the opening of the World Trade Center in 1973.

Today ribbon-cuttings symbolize new beginnings; as similar ceremonies have done for centuries. While ribbons tied together can symbolize a bond between a bride and groom, the cutting of a ribbon signifies a fresh start. A ribbon can be stretched across an entryway to signify that what is behind the ribbon is waiting to be presented to the world.

Ribbon-cutting ceremonies generate media coverage and marketing opportunities. Ceremonial scissors have turned ribbon cuttings into elaborate and sophisticated events, but the idea is a simple concept that has been around for ages. The cutting of

the ribbon symbolizes the 'opening' of something new, much like when a ribbon is cut from a nicely packaged gift before unwrapping. It builds anticipation with the promise of something exciting.
