City and Chamber work to enhance Business Services efforts!

The foundation of Economic Development is providing services to existing businesses – to help them expand and capitalize on opportunities. The services provided are often in the form of data for business planning, as well as information on existing resources and available sites and spaces for expansion.

Mayor Russ Owen has initiated a program to enhance the City's services to businesses and has asked for Chamber President Chrissy Chalk to bring chamber support as well. The program will:

- Provide business owners with important information on available resources for business planning; and
- Will conduct research on key questions about their experience in the City, including:
 - o Why did you choose NSB?
 - o How can the City & Chamber have a positive impact?
 - o Any plans to expand in the next 5 years?
 - Biggest opportunities/challenges/pain point?
 - o Any thought of leaving in the next 5 years? If so, why?
 - o If you could change one thing about NSB...

Individual interviews will be held with a selected number of business owners in each of the City's six target industries identified in the City's Economic Development Plan:

- Aviation & Aerospace
- Creative Class
- Light Industry
- Medical
- Professional
- Recreation

In addition to individual interviews, a series of industry sector/area-specific workshops will be held to provide useful information and engage business owners. The monthly workshops will be held at the Live Oak Cultural Center at 5:30 pm as follows:

- 1. Thursday, April 25: Tourism/Hospitality/Art
- 2. Thursday, May 23: Canal St area
- 3. Thursday, June 27: Beachside area (Flagler, Third, A1A)
- 4. Thursday, July 25: US 1
- 5. Thursday, August 22: SR 44
- 6. Thursday, September 26: Airport, Manufacturing, Technology
- 7. Thursday, October 24: Start-ups and Small Business

US 1 PROJECT STARTS UP!

The Florida Department of Transportation has announced that this long awaited project will begin this month and be completed in the summer of 2020. The project area includes US 1 between Julia St and Smith St., and from Orange to Dimmick St.

Specific improvements include resurfacing, widening, curb and gutter, drainage improvements, sidewalk, signalization, lighting, and water and sewer work. In addition, a second left turn lane onto westbound Canal St, and a new right turn lane from southbound US 1 to westbound Canal St will be created. A new merge lane will be constructed on westbound Canal St from US 1 to just east of Dimmick St, and designated bike lanes will be created along US 1. Additionally, Andrews St will be converted to a one-way roadway heading eastbound from US 1 to the first driveway. The CRA has paid for upgrades to FDOT standard facilities in the Canal St area.

This project will require nighttime land closures that are permitted as follows:

- US 1: 7:30 pm 7 am
- Canal St west of US 1: 8 pm 7 am
- Canal St east of US 1: 10 pm 5 am

Temporary road closures with detours are permitted as follows:

• Lytle Ave at US 1 ramps: Midnight Friday to 5 am Monday (long weekend only)

• E/W Canal St: 10 pm – 5 am (limited to nighttime on weekdays).

Much of the work at the beginning of the project will not require lane closures as the contractor will be working on the west side of US 1 behind barrier walls. All lanes of US 1 will remain open, but they will be shifted very slightly to the east and will be a bit narrower. Electronic message boards will be used to alert drivers of lane closures and detours.

This project will also require sidewalk closures and creation of temporary pedestrian access routes. Signs will be used to guide and direct bicyclists and pedestrians around the work area.

Announcements

- Coming Soon! The space formerly occupied by the French Quarter Restaurant near the HUB on Canal St is undergoing renovation to open as <u>The Local Pearl</u> oyster shoppe.
- Coming Soon! <u>The Posh Pineapple</u> at 330 Canal St is expanding! Renovation work is now underway.
- A <u>Tractor Supply store</u> is being planned for the SE corner of SR 44 and Corbin Park Rd. Zoning was approved at the August 14 City Commission meeting.
- A <u>Hyatt Place Hotel</u> is being planned in the former Outback Plaza across from Norwood's on Third Ave. Zoning was approved at the November 28 City Commission meeting. Construction plans are being finalized.

Private Property Projects

- <u>Publix Expansion underway!</u> The \$20 million expansion of the Publix store at 1930 SR 44 is under construction and includes parking lot improvements.
- <u>Mattress One</u> and <u>Hammock Gardens Dental Care</u> is now open in the new building next to Mullinax Ford on SR 44.
- <u>Riverwalk Condos</u>, NW area of North Causeway: construction continues on several buildings. The first six story condo building with 36 units was featured in a previous Parade of Homes.
- <u>Canal Street Pavilion</u>: the former movie theatre space in the building on the NE corner of Canal and Orange has been renovated and is now called Canal Street Pavilion. Owner Dick Rosedale has several office spaces upstairs still available for lease: 956-0668.

- New Commercial Building at 1890 SR 44 (at the east end of Publix Plaza), 8,800 sq ft under construction.
- New Commercial Building at 701 E Third at Saxon (east bound side of street): two units left to lease for professional office, retail, or restaurant: 690-1636.

- <u>Babe James Splash Pad</u>, east of the building: design work is scheduled to begin soon.
- <u>Tennis/Pickleball Courts in Pettis Park</u>: The pickleball court and the renovated tennis court are both now open.
