I can't believe we are coming to the end of the fourth quarter. With Thanksgiving upon us, and Small Business Saturday on November 24th, I would like to remind everyone to remember to shop small this holiday season.

That really goes for Boutique stores that carries merchandise exclusive to their brand. This is so important because we are emotionally rooted in buying and selling with friends and neighbors. We like to say at the Chamber that people do business with others they know, like and trust. That is part of what we do here—build relationships.

Also remember that small business owners are responsible for 2/3rds of new jobs. About 10 million small businesses are owned by women. One fifth of small businesses are family owned and operated. We have so many wonderful locally owned businesses here in Chandler, please visit the <u>Chamber Directory</u> for more information.

I would also like to wish everyone a very happy Thanksgiving. I know we are thankful for our members who believe in our mission and support our efforts because without you, we would not be able to advocate good policy, connect and educate our members.

### Chandler Mayor Jay Tibshraeny @jaytibshraeny



Earlier this year, the financial website, Wallethub, named Chandler the top city in the country to find a job. This is the product of a decades-long vision to build robust employment corridors throughout the community. These five centers are home to almost 1,900 businesses and close to 88,000 jobs. That represents about 77 percent of all jobs in Chandler.

Anchored by Intel's first manufacturing plant, west Chandler has long been a strong hub for job creation, helped in part by its proximity to the I-10 corridor and Sky Harbor International Airport. West Chandler boasts about 28,000 jobs – second only to the Price Corridor with more than 39,000 jobs. Prime location and infrastructure have helped the Price Corridor thrive over the past two decades with Northrup Grumman (formerly Orbital ATK), Wells Fargo, Infusionsoft, On Trac, Bank of America, General Motors Innovation Center, Rogers, and so many others who continue to expand their presence, helping to drive the Chandler economy and generate new jobs.

Chandler's other three major employment centers are the Airpark Area, Uptown (north) Chandler and our downtown. With Chandler Municipal Airport at its core, and situated along the Loop 202 Santan Freeway, the Airpark is a nine-square-mile area that features numerous business parks and some parcels that enjoy through-the-fence access to the airport proper. This area was strategically planned to include retail, future hotels and entertainment amenities.

Uptown Chandler was recently re-branded to match a more laid-back atmosphere of start-ups and up-and-coming entrepreneurs. It is home to more than 11,000 jobs, many in the light industrial and commercial sectors. With lower real estate costs, infill incentives and our adaptive reuse policy, it is an inviting place for start-ups and established firms alike.

And finally, there is Downtown Chandler. Employment in the City core continues to grow with a number of projects in the pipeline, and an infusion of new residential choices. The office buildings on the east side of Arizona Avenue continue to remain full and new projects are underway on the west side, including Overstreet Chandler and New Square – formerly called the Site 6 project across from City Hall. Both feature a significant injection of new commercial and office space, providing workers a true work-live-play environment.

Chandler's current unemployment rate is 4 percent – well below the state average of 5.3 percent. It should come as no surprise, though. Decades of thoughtful planning have created five dynamic job centers, each with its own characteristics and business appeal. Chandler's solid financial footing and deep talent pool through the years have also lent to the continued confidence employers maintain in Chandler. It bodes well for our future, and for generations to come.
