The kids are going to love these characters! The STEM tent is back with exciting science activities that will make you smile and ask the question, 'How did they do that?'

#### State of the City highlights a strong business community

At my recent State of the City address I was proud to highlight the many accomplishments happening within the Chandler business community.

You may have heard that according to a recent study by the financial website Wallethub, Chandler is the top city in the country for finding a job. Cities were ranked on a number of metrics including job opportunities, employment growth and average salary. In recent months we've seen a lot of companies moving and expanding here – creating those very jobs that placed us number one. They include Walgreen's new Pharmaceutical Center, Loan Care, Enterprise, Optima Tax Relief, Turbo Resources and Microchip.

In the past year, we saw a half-million feet of new office and industrial space open for business with another million square feet currently under construction. And during the event, I was happy to announce our latest locate. Liberty Mutual Insurance is moving into our Chandler Airpark employment center at the Mach One development with 750 jobs that will grow to as many as 1,000 in a short period of time.

I also announced Wells Fargo lease of an additional 190,000 square feet of office space in the Continuum building on the Price Corridor. This means an added 1,200 employees coming to our city. This is in addition to the 5,000 employees who already work on Wells Fargo's existing 800,000-square-foot campus. Great news on these two businesses for Chandler.

New development is taking place in all corners of the community. Particularly in our major employment centers in west Chandler, Uptown Chandler, the airpark, and of course, the Price Corridor. That includes Viridian at the mall. This mixed-use project includes the recently opened Cambria Hotel, housing, and Class A office space under construction. These are all positive signs that people understand and appreciate what is happening here. And they have the confidence to invest in Chandler, and to grow here.


I also touched on automotive technology and all of the firms doing research and development on this technology right in our own backyard. It is exciting to see it ramp up, literally before our eyes. And it solidifies Chandler's reputation as the Innovation and Technology Hub of the Southwest.



## CHANDLER A PUBLIC POLICY RECAP

The Chandler Chamber of Commerce is the voice of Chandler business. Join us for our Public Policy Series addressing issues that concern our business community.

#### **February 9, 2018**

The Chandler Chamber of Commerce welcomed Lana Berry, CFO for Chandler Unified School, and Jill Norgaard, an Arizona Representative, to speak at this month's Public Policy Series.

Lana Berry addressed education reform, recent propositions, and Doug Ducey's education budget. She explained the history and basics of school finance, as well as how the state typically spends money. Berry mentioned Proposition 123 was a great leap in the right direction, which would allow Arizona School Districts to receive proper funding and resources for both teachers and children in Arizona.

She also maintained that the renewal of Proposition 301 is essential, which would benefit Arizona's classroom and communities. There has been increased funding for education, paid by the State Land Trust. Governor Doug Ducey's education budget would bring 100 million dollars and be extended for five years, greatly impacting Chandler Unified School District.

Representative Norgaard followed up on topics that Berry had discussed. She further discussed Propositions 123 and 301, explaining their importance for the future of education. Norgaard talked about the future bills the legislature and state should expect to see regarding issues of public schools and especially charter schools.

#### February 23, 2018

Tom Forese, Chairman of the Arizona Corporate Commission, and Mitzi Epstein, Legislative District 18 Representative, spoke at the Chamber's public policy meeting.

Forese addressed the improvement of the Corporate Commission and future plans for Arizona. He explained that the company is headed in a direction that focuses on the importance of sustainable energy. He emphasized that economic growth is now the central tenant governing the ACC along with plans to make Arizona an energy independent state by 2050.



Epstein began by talking about Science Cafes and how they have allowed her to learn more about self-driving cars, how they work, and how they will affect her district. She also discussed the new technology called Blockchain, along with an overview about Bitcoin. Epstein talked about her passion for education and how she is working in the legislature to help progress education in the State of Arizona. Epstein also updated the meeting about creating a task force in pursuit to reduce the amount of suicides each year.

Ostriches are part of a colorful history in Chandler. By early 1914, there were 6,000 ostriches in the metro Phoenix area - 80 percent of the U.S. total, according to the Chandler Museum.

During the peak, ostrich feathers were selling for \$10 to \$300 a pound. One of the biggest ostrich ranchers was Dr. A.J. Chandler, the city's founder. He owned 550 ostriches, the third largest herd in the Valley, according to the museum.

In 1988 to celebrate the city's ties with the big bird, the Chandler Chamber of Commerce created the Ostrich Festival. The idea for the first festival came from the Chamber's Board of Directors. The 1988 Chamber board was trying to come up with a creative event that would be special to Chandler, and they thought of ostriches.

The festival has garnered national attention for Chandler. The event was featured in the 1995 movie, "Waiting to Exhale" starring Whitney Houston and Angela Bassett. It was also the setting for "Lover Boy," a Harlequin Romance.

In 2006 and 2007, the event hosted the Purina Incredible Dog Challenge, which aired on ESPN. One year a Fox Sports broadcasting crew from Seattle was in town for baseball spring training and came to the festival to take shots of the big birds.

Snapple filmed a commercial at the festival, Animal Planet visited one year along with National Geographic and Trip Flip.

Money magazine has ranked Chandler as No. 30 among the top 100 places to live in the United States, and the article mentioned the ostrich festival as a main attraction!

Currently, the event attracts over 100,000 attendees throughout the 3 days of festivities. While those crazy big birds are in attendance, great music, exciting midway rides and educational and entertaining family activities are the main focus of the popular event. Bands who have appeared over the years include, Joan Jett and the Blackharts, Cheap Trick, Foreigner, Little River Band, Rick Springfield, Starship, Eddie Money, Marshall Tucker, Alice Cooper, Gin Blossoms and Spin Doctors to name a few.

Over 30 nonprofits volunteer at the festival with the Chamber giving back at the end of the 3 day event with donations to the charities.

The event is held at Chandler's Tumbleweed Park every March. Besides music, midways and ostriches, the festival also features vendor booths, arts and crafts, and a wide array of tasty festival food to satisfy the palates of enthusiastic festival goers.

#### The Mayor's 5k and Fun Run

The Mayor's 5K and Fun Run first started in 2007 on the first Saturday before the festival. A kid's Fun Run takes place before the adult run and has attracted over 500 youngsters lining Arizona Avenue for the race. A health fair sets up in downtown Chandler for watchers and runners alike. The medals given to each participant have become collector's items as each one is different.

#### The Ostrich Festival Parade

2007 was also the first Ostrich Festival Parade on Kickoff Saturday. Over 90 entries including bands, dance teams, floats, dignitaries, pageant winners and more parade south on Arizona Avenue to the downtown area. Parade watchers are advised to come early and claim your place to see the action!

#### Classic Car Show and Public Safety Fair

After the Parade and Fun Run visitors can enjoy the amazing classic cars and hotrods at the Classic Car Show. Also in the area is a Public Safety Fair with firetrucks, police cars, demonstrations and more given by Chandler Police and Chandler Health and Fire.
