December 8th Recap

The Chamber was delighted to host both Rustyn Sherer, East Valley Community Affairs Manager for APS, and Aaron Dock, Load Research Manager for SRP, on the December 8th, 2017 edition of the Public Policy Seminar series.

Rustyn Sherer, East Valley Community Affairs Manager for APS, opened by providing a brief insight into the functions of the Arizona Public Service. The presentation showcased that rates have increased well below inflation and that APS continues to focus on both battery storage and solar.

It was noted that research is being made towards integrating renewables into the electrical grid as solar peaks during the day, but demand continues to grow.

Aaron Dock, Load Research Manager for SRP, launched his presentation shortly afterwards. Load research is described as the goal to understand how customers consume and generate electricity, especially as energy consumption is growing year-by-year. The presentation noted that the time of use, thermostats and precooling, electrical vehicles, residential and commercial solar, battery storage, thermal storage, and air conditioning are factors essential to research performed by SRP. Aaron discussed that energy auditors are a reliable information source if one's home is leaking energy and that customers are learning to avoid the three most costly hours of the day, 3pm – 6pm.

Michael Brienza, Community and Chambers Sales Director of Earnhardt Auto Centers, informed the audience of small updates involving the East Valley Chambers of Commerce Alliance and Kevin Hartke, Vice Mayor of Chandler, advised that Chandler projects were progressing as expected with business registration and street renovation plans on the way.
