"Sounds like somebody has a case of the Mondays"

That's a line from the movie, "Office Space." The movie title came to mind (I actually like Mondays!) when I started to think about all the office activity occurring here in Chandler of late.

In mid-October ground was broken on two, Class A office projects in Chandler that will bring hundreds of jobs to the community. The first is The Offices at Chandler Viridian, developed by Hines. It is a six-story, 250,000-square-foot project that joins a Cambria Hotel, multi-family and commercial components within Chandler Viridian near the mall, off of Frye Road and the Price Freeway. Stantec, an architectural and engineering design firm, has already leased space in the building as it merges its Arizona operational base here in Chandler. It's good to see that parcel finally develop as intended, and will be a boon to the Price Road Corridor.

The second project is located on McClintock Drive just north of Chandler Boulevard and is called the Chandler Corporate Center, a 115,000 square-foot project by VanTrust Real Estate. Each of these buildings offers significant speculative space, and it is heartening to see the confidence these developers have in Chandler. And why not? Our current Class A office vacancy rate is about 9.3 percent as compared to just under 14 percent Valleywide.

And downtown, that rate drops to about 3 percent, with more development on the way. That includes Overstreet Chandler that includes Flix Brewhouse Cinemas and a new parking garage that seemingly went up overnight. Within that project is another 17,000 square-feet of second-story office space that will overlook our downtown. Phase 2 of Overstreet will bring an additional 40,000 to 60,000-square-feet of office space. We hope to announce some additional projects for the downtown, our airpark area and other employments centers in the coming months.

Finally, I want to thank the membership for your continued involvement in the many partnerships the City shares with the Chamber of Commerce. That includes "Coffee with the Mayor" that enjoyed record attendance at the October 24 event. It's great to talk about all of the things happening in the City with the members of the business community. Thanks you for the investment you continue to make here each and every day.

October Series Recap

The Chamber was delighted to host both Jeff McBee, Vice President of Hospital Operations for Dignity Health Chandler Regional and Mercy Gilbert Medical Center, and Sean Bowie, Arizona's Legislative District 18 State Senator, on the October 13th, 2017 edition of the Public Policy Seminar series.

Jane Hanson, Chief Operating Officer for Dignity Health Chandler Regional and Mercy Gilbert Medical Centers, opened by providing a brief insight of the future of both Medical

Jeff McBee detailed the master plan of the Dignity Health Chandler Regional Medical Center remodel, designed by the Devenney Group and contracted through McCarthy Building Companies, Inc. The remodel will include the following items: a four story, 96-bed tower including a basement; renovations to the existing building; the inclusion of key hospital outpatient departments; 36 intensive care beds and 60 telemetry beds with 24 shelled beds planned for the future; a new parking garage to accommodate 944 vehicles with additional surface parking to accommodate 205 vehicles; 8 new operating rooms. McBee noted that a "hospital interior and exterior can be confusing" and stressed that the master plan is incorporating a logical layout; in addition, it is estimated that Dignity Health Chandler Regional Medical Center will grow by **150 new jobs** within the first year and 235 new jobs by the fifth year. The presentation came to a close after an audience member stated that she had received wonderful customer service when attending Dignity Health Chandler Regional, "Hello Humankindness is not a motto, it's our culture" answered Jeff McBee.

Sean Bowie, Arizona State Senator of Legislative District 18, launched his presentation by noting a few of his accomplishments in the 2017 Legislative Session: he was the only Democratic Party member to support a bill ceasing frivolous ADA lawsuits; the Arizona Technology Council gifted Bowie with the Tech Warrior Award as a result of his pro-technological stances; his legislative efforts assisted with the passing of ADA compliance standards, additional funding for higher education institutions, and a manufacturing tax credit. Bowie moved the discussion forward into topics of increasing importance for the 2018 Legislative Session: water contracts, opioid addiction, and education funding. Certain water contracts are available to contractors on a bidding basis; however, the State of Arizona is seeking to retain various contracts in order to implement water conservation practices. Regarding opioid addiction, current legislative efforts are pushing towards the increase of funding for methadone clinics, implementing preventative measures, and requiring medical clinics to utilize electronic prescriptions in order for the information to be tracked. The State of Arizona currently ranks **49 in education investment** and the current education deficit appears to be from 50 million to 100 million; however, Bowie added that he is working towards potential workforce development investment in the community college system.

During the October 27th Public Policy meeting, the Chamber had the pleasure of hearing from both the Arizona Senate President **Steve Yarbrough** and **Candice Copple**, the Chief of Staff for the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors Chairman Denny Barney.

Senator Yarbrough provided an overview of the upcoming legislature and briefly spoke about the 2018-2019 budget. The Arizona budget is growing slowly and analysts predict that the state will have approximately an \$80-100 million structural deficit; furthermore, approximately \$148 million will be spent on education and \$159 million is likely to be allocated to Medicaid. The Arizona Department of Revenue recently ruled that **digital goods** are indeed subject to taxation and that has left a significant amount of business confused as to what constitutes a digital good. Senator Yarbrough suspects that clarification at the State level is likely to be an upcoming focus of the legislature in order to ease concerns from local businesses. It was noted that water policy and the jurisdiction of such will become a significant topic in 2018.

Candice Copple presented a brief overview of the current county state of affairs. **Maricopa County** is currently the fourth largest county in the United States based on population (4,242,000 people), the fourteenth largest County by land area (9,255 sq. miles) and the fastest growing county in the United States. Maricopa County is also the 6th largest employer in the State with approximately thirteen thousand employees. The budget for Maricopa County is approximately \$2,494,000,000 with public safety accounting for 53.46% of the budget. The County is also interested in expanding the "Mosaic" program, which assists in-custody inmates with substance abuse and behavioral problems. Copple outlined the following capital improvement projects for 2018: constructing an in-take-transfer-release facility to replace Durango Jail, repurposing Madison Street Jail into the new County Attorney's Office, and improving the public safety radio system.
