The arrival of August in Arizona means the kids go back to school, summer is winding down, monsoons are here and we look forward to the second half of the year and all it has to offer.



If you could host a talk show, who would be your first guest?



Chandler's Workforce Development Coalition Values Partnership with EVIT

The Chandler Chamber of Commerce recently held a workforce development round table with several of their businesses that are primarily trade-based to discuss the future of a skilled workforce. Some of the business represented were based in HVAC, welding, construction, plumbing, electrical, IT and communications. While college is not necessarily a good fit for everyone, a certification, if not a college degree is becoming a standard qualification in today's workforce. A name which surfaced over and over at the Chamber's Trades round table was the East Valley Technical Institute or EVIT.

EVIT is an accredited career and technical school that caters to district, charter and home-schooled high school students who reside in 10 East Valley school districts. This includes students from Apache Junction, Chandler, Fountain Hills, Gilbert, Mesa, Queen Creek, Scottsdale, Tempe, Higley, and J.O. Combs.

Students who enter into this program spend half of the day at the EVIT campus in Mesa in their career focus, and the other half of the day at their high school. EVIT's district vision statement coincides closely with one of the Achieve60Az strategies to make Arizona more competitive in the workforce through the power of education. The strategy is to increase college readiness and high school graduation rates. For this to be achieved, students should be placed in advanced classes, dual enrollment, and obtain early college experience. EVIT provides the edge that Achieve60Az is trying to accomplish with the hands-on learning experience, obtaining college credits, and learning to become competitive in the global workforce. The students who attend the school are certainly living up to the districts vision statement. They have a 98% high school graduation rate, 85% of students were placed in jobs, went to college, or joined the military, and garnered \$2.5 million dollars in scholarships to the class of 2016. And within one year of graduating 1,122 students were hired by Valley businesses.

Xavier Chavez, a recent high school graduate, chose to enter the EVIT program. Xavier was in the Information Technologies and Engineering Careers program which specialized in digital device diagnostics and repair. He said, "It gave me vital skills I needed and made me much more desirable to employers because I learned a lot and gained experience." Xavier now has a job as a Field Service Engineer for Besi North America Inc.

EVIT provides 40 different tuition free programs for high school students that sets them up for success. Students in the EVIT Fire Science Academy can earn numerous industry credentials and dual enrollment college credit to help them prepare for careers as first responders. The Culinary Arts program is the only high school culinary program in Arizona that is accredited by the American Culinary Federation Education Foundation. The Welding program has a 100% success rate in placing students in jobs, college and the military. If students would rather take the classes at their own high school, EVIT partners with Chandler Unified School District and 9 others to provide funding so they can offer technical and career classes at the those schools.

What many people don't realize is that EVIT is not just for high school students. There is also an Adult Education Center at EVIT that offers affordable tuition, and scholarship opportunities for anyone 18 years old and older. Cece Todd, Public Information Officer at EVIT said, "A large range of ages attend EVIT, we will have people attending who are in their 30's or even their 50's that have a job already, but just want to upgrade their knowledge in a particular area of study."

For many young adults it isn't easy choosing a career path. The East Valley Technical Institute can be especially helpful for students who aren't sure if they want to go on to college, giving them a chance to test the waters and hopefully find something they are passionate about pursuing. Terry Locke, Director of Community Relations for Chandler Unified School District, had nothing but positive remarks for the institute. "EVIT provides students with more opportunities to help them find their niche, and to help them prepare for the future."

Years from now the community will still need buildings built, electricity for those buildings, plumbing, air-conditioning and many more services. There is still a need for the trades and EVIT is helping people find their career path to build the future.
