As you can imagine, a city the size of Chandler buys a lot of stuff. Office supplies, fuel, chemicals, vehicles, hardware and software. The list goes on. And we take pride in our work with the local business community to engage them in our purchasing process. At chandleraz.gov/purchasing you can be involved as well. Once there, you can download a brochure on how to do business with the City, learn about our formal purchasing procedures and sign up to become a vendor and submit bids.

The City also has a local business consideration. Any Chandler business with a transaction privilege tax license receives a 1.5 percent benefit in the evaluation of competitive bids. I invite Chamber members to do a little research, and hopefully down the road, we can partner with you through our bidding process.



The members of Chandler's Purchasing Division belong to an elite group of purchasing organizations in government that operate with the highest standards of quality and efficiency. Thanks again to the Chandler purchasing team for its commitment and dedication to their profession, the City and the business community. In fact, March was National Purchasing Month and it was nice to honor our purchasing team with a couple of prestigious national awards recognizing their commitment to the procurement profession.

Chandler also enjoys an excellent business climate for first-time entrepreneurs seeking to enter the market -- as well as experienced business owners looking to expand, relocate, convert and/or renovate an existing space. For several years, we have used our Business Location Team (BLT), to help businesses navigate the process. The mission of the BLT is to help with all stages of your plans to include property development and permit processes.

The team is composed of representatives from the Development Services, Economic Development, Fire and Planning divisions. And we've enjoyed great success helping business owners' dreams come to fruition. If you'd like more information, give James Smith, our Economic Development Program Manager, a call at 480-782-3033.

Finally, we have launched a new electronic plan submission and review program. The system is available now and for the first time enables the City to receive, review and return building and engineering design plans electronically.

The system is integrated with the City's existing permitting software, electronic document management system and electronic payment system. This allows engineers, architects and others to submit plans, receive required correction comments, resubmit corrected plans, pay fees and print final permits entirely online using a customer access portal. What a great way to combine two passions into one awesome day, and of course, give a little back to the community. Every dollar we collect goes directly to LOH.

If you could have dinner with any 3 people, living or dead, who would it be and why?

First would have to be my dad. He passed away about 7 years ago and I've always felt there were things we needed to say to each other but never did. Plus, he was a carpenter and taught me everything I know about woodworking. But he didn't teach me everything HE knew! Another would be Chip Foose. The Price Road Corridor is a five-square-mile area of Chandler and one of Arizona's fastest-growing economic hubs — a thriving employment center for advanced business services, life sciences, aerospace and more that are expected to provide thousands of new jobs.

To maintain reliable electric service in this area and to meet forecasted energy demand, SRP will bring a new double circuit 230-kilovolt (kV) power line from its Knox substation in Chandler to a 230 kV substation site, identified as RS-27, located in the northern section of the Price Road Corridor. The proposed route will run east from the Knox substation, primarily on the south side of the Loop 202, to the north-west portion of the Price Road Corridor.

SRP will hold public open houses to gather comments on route considerations within the project's reduced scope and to review route alternatives to connect the Knox substation with the new RS-27 230 kV substation.
