The Executive Board of the NSVFA is happy to present to you a copy of the NSVFA 2016-2017 Annual Report. Please take the time to review this information as well as to take a copy to your department to share with the membership. In this report you will find:

We continue to work to find ways to improve the Association including new membership software, a complete redesign of your web site and ways to re-energize Annual Conference. Please help the elected officers of the NSVFA to better serve you by providing input and recommendations and know that we welcome your suggestions.

We are happy to report that as of October 12, 2017, the NSVFA has a membership of **6,809** which represents **292** Nebraska Fire Departments. That compares to **6,219** for the same time period last year. As of June 30, 2017, the final NSVFA membership for the 2015-2016 was **7,606** members. Our goal is to meet or exceed this number during the 2017-2018 membership term. **Please help us reach this goal by promoting the NSVFA to departments in your areas** who are not members. For the 2016-2017 term, we also mailed **492** additional newspapers for a total circulation of **8,098** papers.

The E-Board including the District Directors have traveled over **20,000** miles in 2016-17 across Nebraska appearing at meetings, banquets and celebrations, and legislative hearings conducting the business of the Association. Individual reports are available near the end of this report. The NSVFA Executive Board and Fire School Committee would like to report that with careful expenditures of your dues' dollars, the Association remains in great shape financially. Support has been extended to the State Fire Marshall, The Nebraska Firefighters Museum and others. The NSVFA Executive Board thanks all of the members of the NSVFA, Nebraska Fire Chiefs' Association and NSVFA Auxiliary for all their support and assistance provided this past year. FIRST GENERAL BUSINESS SESSION 10AM
Friday, October 21, 2016**

Divot Lodge and Conference Center, Norfolk Nebraska.

Hosted by the Madison Volunteer Fire Department.

President Dell Cerny of Arnold called the meeting to order at 10:19AM.

Pastor Burpo opened with a prayer. The Norfolk Fire Department Honor Guard presented the colors and the pledge of allegiance was recited.

In addition to President Dell Cerny, other NSVFA officers in attendance were 1st Vice President Justin Scamehorn, Waco; 2nd Vice President Marlene Bomar, Madison; Secretary Treasurer Micheal Dwyer, Arlington; Legal Advisor Jim Egr, David City; District Director Jim Horn, Schuyler; William ‘Bill’ Lundy, York; Parrish Abel, Gering; and Ralph Quick, Sutherland.

President Cerny again thanked Madison Volunteer Fire Department for hosting this great event and invited Mayor Alvin Brandl to welcome NSVFA to Norfolk and encouraged us to enjoy the city. Also, a representative from the Divots Conference Center welcomed the membership as well.

President Cerny invited Secretary Dwyer to the podium to read the roll call. Roll call showed 47 departments answering roll call. Mr. Dwyer also reported that the NSVFA has 297 Department memberships and over 6,219 members as of Oct. 15th.

The 2016 Annual Report was passed out. A Motion to approve the minutes was made by Eric Rasmussen and seconded by Bill Pfeifer. All approved. Motion carried.

Note that \$373,494.04 Expended through the SAFER Grant thus far (Majority caused by SAFER GRANT expenses) which ends this year.

Safer Grant: There was discussion about the SAFER grant, and that we were not renewed for the grant. There was also discussion about the state of the association. Financially, we are in a good place. Motion was made to accept the financial report by Bob Tichota and seconded by Matt Kellen. Motion carried.

Legislative Report: Jerry Stilmock talked about Legislative items, priority bills and items that were passed and not passed. Also talked about the point system for the \$250 tax credit, which needs to be done by volunteers to keep track of fire and EMS calls.

NSVFA Officer Nominations: President Cerny called for nominations for all elected positions of the Nebraska State Volunteer Firefighters Association:

Also discussed was the Host city for the next conference in 2017. No nomination, leave open. Constitutional by-law changes discussed, the items changed are in bold print.

A motion to recess was made by Eric Rasmussen and seconded by Eldon Moser.

**General Session #2 NSVFA Annual Conference
Friday, October 21, 2016 1:33pm**

State Fire Marshall's Office:

Jim Heine and Alan Joos from the State Fire Marshalls office talked about NEFIRS reporting. It was at 42% but now is at 50%. The Fire Marshalls office has a new web page. Alan stated that on part of the new web page you can view new and upcoming classes. You can also register and pay for your classes online.

Nebraska Forest Service:

Lew Sieber from Nebraska Forest Service presented a video of what it's like to be in the 'seat' of Nebraska SEAT T475. You can view this video by going to YouTube and searching Nebraska SEAT T475 2016. Lew also talked about the permanent SEAT bases along with a mobile base, with a second base being planned. Also discussed was the yellow card reporting system, you can now do it on the website. Lew also discussed the importance of reporting your wildfires.

National Volunteer Fire Council:

Joel Cerny and Norm Hoeft, representatives for the NVFC talked about the NVFC Conference on September 25, 2017 being held in Kearney. In addition, for more information about being a firefighter you can go to makemeafirefighter.org.

Nebraska Fire Chiefs:

Jerry Thompson with the Fire Chiefs talked about the elections and the scholarship. We can't seem to give the scholarship away. They are working with South East Community College regarding the scholarship. Discussed getting burn permits on cell phones, they are not there yet.

Nebraska Firefighters Museum & Education Center:

Erika Smith from the Nebraska Firefighters Museum & Education Center discussed the need of donations to keep the museum open.

Nebraska Pheasants Forever:

Brian Teeter from Nebraska Pheasants Forever along with being on NE Prescribed Fire Counsel talked about the Annual Conference in Kearney on December 2nd. Brian also talked about the training workshops of which they have 6 different ones. Discounts will be given to firefighters.

EMS Committee:

Marlene Bomar talked about the current changes and this will be put it in the paper. Discussed community protocols, rules and regulations. EMS districts have changed.

Justin Scamehorn talked about how the tax credit works, someone in the department is in charge at the fire station and that person turns in the data to the Department of Revenue. John Virgil stated that there is a spreadsheet ask Mike. Discussed Annual conference and the decrease in number of attendees. Bill Lundy stated that no one put in for the 2018 conference. Suggested moving the date of the conference. Talked about suspending the by-laws for 2018 long enough to play with Conference.

Rhonda Meyer from Blair suggested going to neighboring towns to see why they weren't at conference. A comment was made to suspend longer than 3 years and form a committee to help out.

There was also conversation about giving businesses who have employees that are fire fighters a tax credit. Jim Egr stated that your employer cannot fire you if you are part of the National Guard and you are deployed. Why aren't our fire fighters and EMS good enough too? Why aren't they protected, from not losing their job. Jim also suggested not to suspend rules and by-laws but leave the 2018-2020 and give the board a chance.

Annual Conference:

There was discussion that we cannot bring younger people here if we don't listen to them, what they want and what's in it for them and is it worthwhile for them. John Bomar suggested more training and a speaker. He also mentioned that the cost to host the conference is around \$25K. There was discussion about the financial situation of the association. Even if we change they won't come. No advertising, no books or selling of ads to raise money. Have 1 meeting instead of 3. Micheal Dwyer stated that the association is in good financial standing, we have enough money in the association that we can create value for the younger people and we market the hell out of it. Paul from York stated that they have no idea what we do here except elect officials, we need education. Mark from Wymore stated that we need to start somewhere, we need to form a committee and hold the conference in the same place for 2-3 years, get a contract with room discounts. Mark also suggested that for the 2018-2020 the Executive-board form a committee and continue to plan. Motion was made by show of hands and carried.

There being no further business and the meeting was adjourned.

NSVFA Conference Fire House of Delegates First Session, October 21, 2016

Justin Scamehorn: This is your opportunity to bring items before the Board. Discussed \$250 Tax credit.

Scott Schremmer, Chadron, NE: Discussed Tax credit policy & procedure. Discussed designating someone in the department to keep track of the points and calls etc. Discussed the Nebraska Department of Revenue does not have system in place yet. Departments need to track meetings, trainings, etc.

Pat Miller, Columbus, NE: Do we have guide lines and numbers to qualify for the Tax credit? (Justin has the handout)

Dell Cerny: EMS separate from Fire calls. Questions about split departments - number of EMS calls versus Fire calls.

Jeff Horn, Fullerton, NE: Mike has point system at the office in Arlington. If anyone has a point system that works would you please share. Talk to Mike about getting an easier system. Mike mentioned a computer guy at the school that could help.

Mike Hoefl, North Platte, NE: Talked about calls - station versus assigned company and on getting a hand out-from Jerry Stilmock. Cancer class covering LODD professional firefighters and not volunteer firefighters?

Bill Pfeifer, Madison, NE: Discussed proposed amendment changes. Section 6 voted board of director, executive director. By-law change-not hire, first change is to hire. Clarification on titles such as board of directors versus executive board. Wording and flexibility.

Jim Egr: Article 6, Section 6 states that we may appoint an Executive Director, Chaplin, lobbyist and legal counsel.

Dale Holbein, Lexington, NE: Appoint versus Hire? What is the cost?

Conference:

Justin Scamehorn: We need to change the direction of where we are going, lots of ideas being discussed along with the future of this conference. How are we going to get more people involved? Better attended 10 years ago.

Bill Pfeifer: What has the Eboard talked about? One spot every year, moving the date of the conference, work schedules, younger generation not interested. Their mindset is what is in it for us? Have a class on Friday, hold meetings on Saturday. People at conference also need to go back and advocate to the younger people on the fire department.

Brad Anderson, Kearney, NE: Suggested larger education classes, instead of just meetings. The younger generation wants education and skills.

Scott Schremmer, Chardon, NE: Conference: First 2 hours why aren't we doing a class now for people who aren't attending the meetings?

Dale Holbein: We need to make conference shorter. Why are we doing 3 meetings? We need to change the constitution. Time to change.

Ken Rempe, Superior, NE: Younger ones don't want to go to meetings.

Mike Stromitis, North Platte, NE: Putting minutes for every department not necessary to say what they are doing. Committee reports as the members. Suggested Eboard give the town hosting the conference \$2500 to help with cost, along with moving the date.

John Virgil, Wahoo, NE: Younger kids are on their phones, this is how we should be communicating with the younger crowd. Facebook, more social media. Redesign website.

Strive:

Doug Janssen, Dakota City, NE: Strive Grant? Grant has been denied, we will reapply in January.

2016 EMS HOUSE OF DELEGATES – First Session

The 2016 NSVFA Annual Conference was hosted by the Madison Volunteer Fire and Rescue at Divots Lodge in Norfolk Nebraska. On Friday, October 21, 2016 the EMS House of Delegates session was called to order by NSVFA 2nd Vice President Marlene Bomar at 8:06 am. The Sergeant of Arms, Don Nelson and Craig Bristol could vouch for the 36 Delegates and Alternates in attendance at this session.

Marlene Bomar shared results of the NSVFA Survey that was distributed at the Nebraska State Fire School. The committee members are currently striving to consider some changes as a result of the questionnaire that could possibly increase membership, attendance and involvement with the NSVFA.

Marlene Bomar introduced **Mr. Tim Wilson** from the Nebraska Health and Human Services Office. Tim is the EMS & Trauma Director whom was recently hired to fill the position that had been handled by Mr. Dean Cole. Mr. Wilson reviewed his various plans and goals for his office to improve the communications and services offered from HHS. The group seemed appreciative of his comment of “we would like to help you”. Many of the new proposals he discussed are very favorable for the Emergency Medical Services and providers in the state.

Various questions from the floor were answered and Mr. Wilson shared his contact information and stressed to contact him if you have any questions or concerns that the staff in his office can help you with.

The Friday, October 21, 2016, EMS House of Delegates was closed following this presentation and will meet again on Saturday, October 22, 2016 at 8:00 am.

Chuck Hoffman said that some fire districts do not support EMS and some do.

2016 EMS HOUSE OF DELEGATES 2nd Session

The second session of the EMS House of Delegates was called to order by NSVFA 2nd Vice President Marlene Bomar on Saturday, October 22, 2016 with 29 in attendance. Mark Meints, Wymore commented that many of the attendees were impressed with the presentation on Friday, by Mr. Tim Wilson of HHS and suggested that he be considered as a speaker at the Nebraska State Fire School in the EMS Class.

Marlene Bomar introduced Doug Dekker, Simulation Program Liaison for the University of Nebraska Medical Center. Doug explained what SIM-NE will have to offer for emergency providers throughout the state. SIM-NE is a partnership of several educational institutions, various academic departments representing a number of disciplines, charitable organizations and public agencies that are dedicated to improving the health and well-being of Nebraskans.

Created through a generous leadership grant from The Leona M and Harry B Helmsley Charitable Trust, a three-year step-down plan of support has been put in place to get this program up and running. Doug stated they are hoping to have the trailers available in April or May in the State of Nebraska, with plans to have four trailers available for the four EMS districts. This would place a trailer in Scottsbluff, Kearney, Norfolk and Lincoln to better serve the emergency personnel with this great training opportunity.

Following Doug's presentation, Marlene Bomar introduced Jessica Scherbath of St. Elizabeth Burn Center in Lincoln, Nebraska. Jessica is the Community Health Educator for the Regional Burn and Wound Center and shared information with the group as to what is available through their facility. She stressed the valuable free education that is available to emergency responders and invited everyone to visit the booth she has at the conference if they would like additional information.

Jessica shared highlights of the recent Burn Camp and information concerning Survivors Offering Assistance to Recovery Program. She also noted the appreciation the center has for the NSVFA Auxiliary as they have made generous donations to the Burn Center over the past 40 years.

Before the close of the session NSVFA Secretary Michael Dwyer shared some information concerning membership and ideas shared to improve the association.

The 2016 EMS House of Delegates was adjourned at 9:15 am with no items for discussion or motions to come before the membership in General Session.

**General Session #2 NSVFA Annual Conference:
Saturday, October 22, 2016 - 9:30am**

Call to order by President Cerny

Pastor Burpo provided the message.

Stephanie Whitmore from **California Causality** gave an explanation of what they do. Please let her (or the NSVFA office) know if you have any questions or if you have any cases or events.

There was discussion about a **Presumptive Cancer bill** in the legislature this year.

Fire and EMS Houses of Delegates: There was discussion about combining the two houses – Bill Lundy gave a history of the 2 houses and the one vote per department concept. There was a motion and a second to combine the two houses into one. There was a lot of conversation about the motion and second. There was a motion to call the question - which passed – and a vote on the motion to combine the two houses – which passed.

EMS House Report: Marlene Bomar reported that the SIM-NE mobile/truck simulators are coming to Nebraska. Jessica Scherbath from the St. Elizabeth burn center gave a great program on burns and rehab. There were no motions from the EMS House of Delegates.

Jim Egr made and then withdrew a motion to dispense with the reading of the committee reports after much conversation.

Recruiting and Retention Committee Shane Cutler reported on behalf of the committee. The SAFER Grant has NOT been renewed. To date; the grant has paid out over 1.8 MILLION DOLLARS. However, 800-Fireline will be supported for the near future. ADAPT – the company that manages the SAFER Grant created USB drives that contain a lot of recruiting and retention tools, documents and info. Also; NSVFA has purchased a small trailer to haul stuff back and forth to NE Fire School and Conference. ADAPT – with grant funds – was able to wrap the trailer with great, promotional, recruiting and retention graphics. You can see it outside of our meeting rooms! Shane closed by saying that he still feels very honored to be leading the recruiting and retention committee and the good work it does.

Rhonda Cerny presented the annual **Fire Prevention** report. She thanked her committee and shared great stories of fire prevention working. She reminded all of us to check and change our smoke detectors regularly. Detectors should be checked every month and replaced at least every ten years. Finally, she reminded that Fire Prevention awards for departments are due in March. Keep the applications coming!

Randy Barnes presented for the Special Recognition Committee. The committee judged the NSVFA Auxiliary letters and others. He reminded everyone to send in their letters and info.

William ‘Bill’ Lundy talked briefly about the First Net radio system being worked on in Nebraska. He serves on the ‘roll out’ committee. The system would make available a ‘block’ of cell phone bandwidth for exclusive use by first responders. The state plan should be available in early 2017.

Micheal Dwyer talked about the Legislative Committees work on EMS jurisdictions. Currently no one entity in Nebraska (or in many places across the country) is responsible for EMS delivery and funding. Options being explored include county boards, rural fire district boards, hospitals and cities. The ultimate question is who pays for it. Jim Horn and Eric Rasmussen commented on the idea from rural board members' perspective.

Much discussion was given to the NSVFA and Fire Chief's scholarships – neither was used or even had any applications this year. Several members mentioned that it was a great benefit. Micheal mentioned he believed the office could do a much better job of promoting the scholarships and that any new web solution that NSVFA considers should be able to help with that. All agreed, let's give it a year.

A motion was made by Shane Cutlers of Raymond and seconded by Brad Anderson of Kearney to include NSVFA members and their children in any scholarships available through NSVFA. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Eric Rasmussen of South East Rural and seconded by Marshall Robinson of North Platte to adjourn. Motion carried. Adjourned at 11:22.


