

No refunds are given after the first of the month, regardless of the date the student leaves the program, and no refunds are given for any prepaid tuition. 6) For accounts 30 days past due, student will be suspended and an official letter will be issued to Financially Responsible Party as formal notification. Student WILL NOT be permitted to attend class until balance is received and a valid credit card placed on file for payments thereafter.
