





Step 3: A city-wide program develops which concurrently supports more biking and local

Step 4: Individuals bike to more places more often. Businesses see more bike traffic, increased customer loyalty amongst bike riding customers and instantly become a bikefriendly establishment through participation.

Becoming a NEW Bike Benefits Member Includes:

- 10 program helmet stickers, 2 large member decals, 1 small member decal, 1 index card
- Comes with 10 all-weather Bike Benefits program helmet stickers @ \$2.50 each, 2 window decals showing participation/Bike Benefit program description, 1 small decal for the cash register (or place where you want people to see it but don't have a lot of room), and 1 index card which explains the program and encourages point of purchase sticker sales.
