Wednesday, February 27, 2019 from 11-3:30



Minnesota Chamber's Top 5 Priorities:

Doug Loon, President of the Minnesota Chamber announced their five major priorities which will frame the Minnesota Chamber Federation initiatives at the Legislature:

- Tax competitiveness: Ensure that our tax climate supports long-term success.
- Health care: Ensure quality care is affordable and accessible to all Minnesotans while enhancing the ability of employers to provide coverage to their employees.
- Workplace mandates: Preserve the right of private employers to develop wage and benefit packages that best suit the distinctive needs of companies and employees.
- Transportation: Ensure Minnesota has a safe, reliable and efficient multimodal transportation system through sustained and strategic funding for roads, bridges and transit.
- Workforce development: Accelerate private-sector workforce efforts to help employers attract and retain the skilled workers they need to compete.

The Minnesota Chamber policy team works full-time on behalf of its members. These priorities were determined after consulting with local chambers.
