NEW WAGE THEFT LAW

The Minnesota Chamber worked hard to pass the compromise state legislation that will help protect employers who inadvertently find themselves in violation of certain wage laws, while increasing penalties for employers who intentionally shortchange paychecks.

The new law's increased notice and record-keeping requirements go into effect July 1, 2019. Criminal sanctions take effect Aug. 1, 2019. The Chamber wants to arm you with all of the details to comply with this law.

The new requirements for all Minnesota employers include an employee notice requirement, plus additional information for already-required earnings statements and employer recordkeeping. Increased enforcement of state wage and hour laws and criminal penalties for employers that commit wage theft are also included in the new law.

MINNESOTA RETAILERS ASSOCIATION LEGISLATIVE OUTCOMES

Minnesota Retailers Association published their 2019 Sate Legislative Outcomes indicating differences between the House, Senate and the Governor included "closed door, non-public meetings between Governor Tim Walz, House Speaker Melissa Hortman, and Senate Majority Leader Paul Gazelka. In the spirit of Game of Thrones, the three parties were referred to by some as 'the tribunal' as select legislators met with the three to decide the most difficult budget and policy areas.

"The end process aside, divided government did produce compromise this session. We ended with a state budget less than what the Governor and House proposed, but more than the Senate put forward. We ended with the enactment of some policy provisions that as representatives of the retail community we are concerned about, however many of the policies we thought went too far didn't become law. In the end, the process produced a compromise budget that balanced out the policy ideas of Democrat and Republican legislators."

Key highlights included non-passage of workplace mandates that fail to recognize differences in various retail operating models; lowering of statewide business property taxes; and unfortunate modifications to June accelerated tax payments passed solely to fill a budget gap.
