Do Action Training Systems courses certify someone to become a firefighter in Texas?

Our courses do not in-and-of themselves provide certification. Our courses teach to current NFPA standards and are designed to be used as a part of an overall program of instruction led by an instructor. Our courses are a teaching tool as are manuals and PowerPoint presentations.

Example of a training program session:

An instructor might assign students to:

- Read a chapter in IFSTA's *Essentials of Fire Fighting* or Jones & Bartlett's *Fundamentals* manual
- Successfully complete the corresponding ATS courses that line up with the material in that chapter
- Attend an instructor-led classroom discussion about that material and department specific SOGs
- Attend a hands-on training session to practice the skills studied

Completing an entire program of instruction with all of these elements can help meet the requirements for certification.
