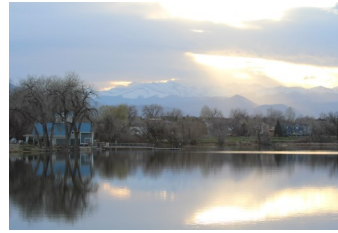


Welcome to Lafayette, Colorado



HISTORY OF LAFAYETTE Lafayette and Mary Miller were among the thousands of immigrants to make their homes along the front range of the Rocky Mountains in 1862. They originally stopped in a small settlement, now known as Longmont, and two years later made their permanent home in the present site of Lafayette. Mr. Miller died in 1877, leaving his wife to raise six small children on her own. In 1884, the richest vein of coal in the Boulder Valley was discovered on the Miller Ranch. Mary Miller platted a 150-acre town site in 1888 and named it Lafayette, after her late husband. The town was incorporated in 1889 and continued to flourish for the next 50 years in an economy based on coal mining. When the coal industry declined, Lafayette relied on agriculture for its continuing prosperity. As Denver and Boulder grew, Lafayette became primarily a residential community and remained as such until fairly recently.

TODAY IN LAFAYETTE Today, City officials are actively seeking expansion of the community's commercial and industrial base, with an emphasis on quality development and service provision. Citizens of today's Lafayette value their heritage, unique neighborhoods, vibrant economy and active lifestyles. The City Council envisions a future that mixes small town livability with balanced growth and superior technologies. This town of 29,000 offers the best in education, recreation, climate, health care, and community services. Farms can be found within and surrounding the town, where you can choose your own life style. Attractive, well cared for neighborhoods offer housing choices to meet almost everyone's needs. Lafayette has carefully set aside greenbelts, bikeways, parks, and open space to preserve the natural atmosphere of this city.

HOUSING Diverse housing options are available in Lafayette. Lafayette residents display pride in their community. Well-kept neighborhoods, tree-lined streets, and carefully planned parks and open space form transitions between all the neighborhoods in Lafayette. Home prices range from \$140,000 to \$1,000,000, with the average home price at \$350,000. In addition to single family homes, there are many townhouse, condominium and apartment communities as well as four mobile home parks. Contact local Realtors and the local paper for availability. TAXES Local Property Tax: Taxes on residential and commercial property are levied against a taxable or “assessed” value. Residential assessment is 10% of assessed value and commercial assessment is 29% of assessed value. In Lafayette, an annual property tax of 76.617 mills (\$1.00 of tax per \$1000 of assessed value) is levied on real and personal property. The following example illustrates the calculation of property taxes. A \$200,000 house would have a taxable or assessed value of \$20,000 (\$200,000 X 10%) X 76.617 mills or about \$1512 in annual taxes.

Local Sales Tax: Sales and use taxes levied in Lafayette total 8.40%.

State Income Taxes:

REGISTRATIONS & LICENSING

Driver’s Licenses can be obtained at Driver’s License Bureau, 2850 Iris, Boulder, 303-442-3006 or 917 Main St., Unit 600 in Longmont, 303-776-4073.

Voter Registration To vote in Colorado, you must be 18 years old, a resident of Colorado, living and registered in your precinct 32 days prior to an election, and a US citizen by birth or naturalization. Boulder County Annex, 1376 Miners Drive Lafayette, CO 80026, 303-413-7710.

Pet Licensing must be obtained from the City of Lafayette, 1290 S. Public Rd., Lafayette, 303-665-5588. Proof of current rabies vaccinations is required. A Leash Law and Pooper-Scooper law are also in effect and strictly enforced in Lafayette.

Emissions Testing is required by Colorado state law. All emissions testing is done by Envirotest Systems Corp. Call the Air Care Colorado hotline at 303-456-7090 or on the internet at www.aircarecolorado.com for information on testing center locations, hours of operation, cost, etc.

Auto Registration / Titles Although these are two separate documents, in Colorado the information, applications, and fees for both can be accomplished in one process. If transferring from another state, you will need to provide the following information: Certificate of Title for the vehicle; Current registration VIN verification via a dealer, emissions-testing station or law-enforcement agency; Emissions test requirement.

License Plates & Tags must be obtained within five days of establishing residency or employment. A \$1000 fine will be levied if plates are not obtained within 30 days. Before obtaining Colorado plates, you must have verification of your vehicle’s motor and serial numbers, your title or vehicle registration and an emissions-inspection sticker. Fees are based on your vehicle’s weight, age and taxable value. These registrations, as well as temporary permits, assessor’s records and marriage licenses may be obtained at The Boulder County Annex, 1376 Miners Dr. Lafayette, CO 80026, 303-413-7710.

RECREATION Recreational opportunities abound in Lafayette. The award-winning **Bob L. Burger Recreation Center** features a 4-pool aquatics area, a lazy river ride, a 150 foot waterslide, and a fitness atrium with extensive free-weights, Cybex machines, LifeCycles, and other cardiovascular machines. Other amenities include racquetball courts, an indoor oval running track, a multi-purpose meeting room equipped with kitchen, and a sauna, steam, and whirlpool area. Visitors may purchase a daily pass, a punch card, or an extended use membership. For information call 303-665-0469.

Lafayette has 17 city parks ranging from neighborhood playgrounds to large community parks: **Waneka Lake** has picnic facilities and a jogging-fitness trail; **LaMont Does Park** includes an outdoor water park/ pool open during the summer months. BALL FIELDS Lafayette has two ball field areas. LaMont Does field is an adult softball field offering summer and fall leagues and is open to the public during off hours. Phone 303-673-9135 for more info. City Park fields are located next to the Rec. Center and offer summer youth T-Ball, baseball and softball for kids ages 4-14 and is open to the public during off hours.

GOLF The City of Lafayette operates **Indian Peaks Golf Course**, an 18-hole regulation course designed by golf champion Hale Irwin. The facility, which is located at Baseline Rd. and 95th St./Hwy. 42, features a full pro shop, snack bar, and driving range. For more information call the golf course pro shop at 303-666-4706.

IN-LINE HOCKEY RINK Lafayette’s full-sized outdoor in-line hockey rink is located next to the Recreation Center and is open to the public, offering league hours, drop-in times for youths and adults, and limited rental times.

MUSEUM The Lafayette Miners’ Museum, located at 108 E. Simpson St., contains a wealth of information concerning the town of Lafayette from the early days of its pioneer heritage, through the coal mining years, to the present. It is open to the public Thursdays and Saturdays from 2—4 PM, or by appointment. Visitors are welcome. Phone 303-665-7030 for more information.

LAFAYETTE SENIOR CENTER The Lafayette Senior Center, 103 S. Iowa St., 303-665-9052, offers a wide variety of programs and services for the promotion of health, wellness, recreation, and social activities for adults 55 years and older. The center also offers consultations to seniors, caregivers and families to help find resources and meet a variety of needs.

WANEKA LAKE BOAT HOUSE offers canoe and paddle boats for rent from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Electric boats are available for seniors or people with disabilities. Please call 303-673-9124 for more information.

SKATE PARK The state of the art skate park includes: three bowls, a snake run ditch, a manhole cover punching skyward from the concrete, and a plaza with railings, granite hubbas and marble ledges is located next to the Recreation Center and is open to the public.

Other amenities in Lafayette include the **YMCA** which contains an indoor ice-skating/hockey rink, gymnasiums and a fitness center (Call 303-664-5455), and Coal Creek/Rock Creek Corridor. All throughout Boulder County outdoor enthusiasts can take advantage of hiking, biking, skiing, fishing, boating, horse-back riding and more. Many choices await area residents when it comes to arts and entertainment. Big name performers, theater, museums, amusement parks, the symphony and opera present a never-ending array of things to do and see all year long...and all within a short drive from Lafayette.
