NONPROFIT OF THE YEAR NOMINEES

BLUE SPRUCE HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

Blue Spruce Habitat for Humanity has enabled 41 families or individuals to obtain affordable housing in our mountain communities since 1990. Homeowners must be income-qualified, work on their own homes and homes of others, and be able to afford a mortgage. Habitat provides workforce housing, strengthening local employers since it's hard to find employees who live in the Evergreen area. These homeowners also get involved in the community because they live here. Habitat energizes community groups that care about affordable housing to volunteer. In 2018 over 1,300 volunteers contributed 8,285 hours helping to build homes or working in the ReStore. Thanks to the ReStore 110 tons of materials were diverted from landfills in 2018.

BOOTSTRAPS

Higher education is fundamental to being successful in today's world. Many families struggle to keep up with the ever-increasing financial burden of sending their children to college. Bootstraps Scholarships and Loans assists families by alleviating some of this financial burden. Bootstraps awards scholarships and interest-free loans to graduating high school seniors. All scholarships and loans are funded by local individuals, businesses, civic groups, and private foundations. In 2018, 56 new and continuing students received a combined total of \$222,000 in scholarships and loans. Since Bootstraps was founded in 1945, more than \$3.8 million in scholarships and loans have been distributed to over 1,800 students. The mission of Bootstraps, with the support of the community, is to eliminate financial barriers to continuing education for students of the mountain community.

CENTER FOR THE ARTS EVERGREEN

The center supports Evergreen and its surrounding communities in the visual and performing arts, bringing the arts and community together. Center For The Arts Evergreen hosts classes, workshops, exhibitions and cultural events.

DRIVE SMART

Drive Smart provides much-needed education regarding safe driving practices for all ages. Their fundraising events are wildly popular and unite our community. They integrate education with exciting events including the Revel the Rockies Marathon, and Triple Bypass. Drive Smart is an important community asset.

ELK RUN ASSISTED LIVING

Elk Run is a nonprofit, faith based organization here in our beautiful mountain community of Evergreen, that offers assisted living and respite services. Respite services are an option for families who need guilt-free time away from caregiving or for the person who needs additional rehabilitation before going home. They have a tranquil setting in the foothills of the mountains and have been in this community for 17 years. In Colorado, their care community helps residents celebrate life as they live it to the fullest. Elk Run residents are an active group and they have a great zest for life.

EVERGREEN'S ALLIANCE FOR SUSTAINABILITY + YOU (EAS+Y)

EAS+Y has been very active in the community this year by bringing a composting program to Evergreen for the first time, expanding Tree Recycling, growing their Zero Waste Services, and helping Green Teams find success in schools along with continuing to support the community gardens and various other sustainability initiatives. With partnerships all around town, EAS+Y plays a valuable role in our community by providing us with many opportunities to take action and make a difference in all areas of sustainability. We all want to keep Evergreen "Green" and EAS+Y is helping us make it happen!

EVERGREEN CHRISTIAN OUTREACH

Evergreen Christian Outreach (EChO) made a huge impact on lives of those in need in 2018. The Food Bank distributed 314,659 pounds of food via 7,357 individual client visits, a 17% increase. Summer lunches were provided to 69 families and over 573 holiday meals were provided at Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. The Adopt-a-Child program provided Christmas gifts to 107 children. Client Services provided nearly \$78,000 in emergency assistance. Our Shelter Program greatly expanded service to the homeless by raising our temperature threshold to 32°. We have also assisted several homeless get jobs and secure housing. The Resale Store raised funds to support EChO programs with over \$150,000 in net income. The Job Program provided 1,040 training services to those in our community seeking employment and to seniors to improve their computer skills. EChO continues to expand its service to Evergreen's needy by executing its new Strategic Plan for growth.

EVERGREEN LUTHERAN CHURCH

Evergreen Lutheran Church has been a focal point of ministry and service to Evergreen for more than 60 years. Evergreen Lutheran's budget consistently includes benevolent commitments to many nonprofits in the area. Imagine a nonprofit supporting other nonprofits that they may accomplish their good work, too. Evergreen Lutheran has, for the last 7 years, hosted with 6 other churches, an Alternative Gift Fair. This event garners more than \$100,000 for nonprofit vendors in a mere 13 hours each year. ELC has hosted an annual Grove Sale for 26 years. In that time ELC has donated ALL the sale's profits (about 1/2 million dollars) back to the community.

MONTESSORI SCHOOL OF EVERGREEN (MSE)

For over 40 years MSE has been growing great human beings, by offering students high-caliber Montessori education (a method that research shows has lasting impacts on cognitive and social/emotional growth), as well as impactful experiential learning that takes academic content and puts it in a real-world context. MSE's 40-year history of excellence in Montessori education includes serving as a national model and internship site for teachers in training. With the incorporation of day field-studies, overnight trips, internships and mentorships MSE builds a well-rounded and robust educational experience. MSE graduates are sought after at the high schools they attend because they bring not only the academic preparation, but also the social/emotional maturity that makes them contributing members of the schools and organizations they are part of.

MOUNT EVANS HOME HEALTH CARE & HOSPICE

Mount Evans Home Health Care & Hospice is National award-winning, and state recognized for superior home health care and hospice services. A true community service for those health issues and tough emotional times when help is needed. No one is turned away based on their ability (or not) to pay for assistance received. Mount Evans Home Health Care & Hospice is a team of dedicated health care professionals and support staff who assist each other with providing over-the-top care for clients within the greater Evergreen area. A local treasure with nationally recognized professionalism.

OVATION WEST PERFORMING ARTS

This year, the Evergreen Chorale rebranded as Ovation West Performing Arts. Established in 1972, the organization has grown and now serves the community in 6 areas: the Evergreen Chorale, Ovation West Musical Theatre, Altezza Chamber Choir, Summer Music Camp, Shining Stars Concert Series, and Center Stage. They create a wide range of musical experiences which impact all ages: toddlers participating in a parent-child music class at Center Stage, youth attending camp or acting in musicals, singers from ages 14 to 88 in the Chorale, and patrons of all ages attending performances. Ovation West opens Center Stage as the performance home for the Evergreen Players, Evergreen Children's Chorale and other groups for meetings and events, donates a portion of revenue from its musicals to nonprofits, and offers discounted tickets to students & seniors.

ROTARY CLUB OF EVERGREEN

Evergreen Rotary Club and their membership volunteer in the local community for many events including Recycle Day, Salvation Army Bell Ringing campaign, Foothills Home, Garden and Lifestyle Show, EHS Interact Club, and the ECHO Food Bank.

SCL HEALTH LUTHERAN MEDICAL CENTER

SCL Health- Lutheran Medical Center plays a unique role in promoting health and caring for people throughout their life from birth to end-of-life. Of the \$44 million Lutheran provided in community benefit (2017), \$38 million supported charity care and funding shortfalls from Medicaid programs, directly benefitting many Evergreen residents. Lutheran has served the Denver metro area including the mountain community of Evergreen for over 100 years.

Innovation, women's care, leading edge cardiac/stroke care and a senior emergency room are areas of excellence. Nationally, the hospital was named one of Americas 50 best hospitals in 2018. Patients and family members often express gratitude for the care and compassion offered by physicians, nurses and care team many who call Evergreen home. Health education and outreach programs provide additional benefit to the community.

SENIORS' RESOURCE CENTER

The Seniors' Resource Center's comprehensive program includes such services as bus pickup of Seniors for doctor appointments and grocery shopping, Meals on Wheels, educational classes and safe caregiving at the Yellow House Center; free Friday luncheons and organized field trips as well as purposeful social and fun activities for Seniors. The personnel and volunteers are welcoming, kind, helpful, and respectful of Seniors with any kind of affliction and pay scale. The host of local volunteers at the Seniors' Resource Center are the epitome of genuine service - a true example of what is loved about the Evergreen community.

WOMEN OF EVERGREEN BUSINESSES (WEB)

WEB has continued every year to help families and individuals in the mountain community who are going through a crisis. They have paid for medical treatment, paid bills and provided cash. They have also done large fundraisers to support other Nonprofits in the mountain community. They've raised funds to support veterans and their families, suicide prevention and awareness, and women and children victims of domestic violence. The members of WEB are local women business owners and professionals who are leaders in our mountain community.

VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR NOMINEES

BRYAN MCFARLAND

Bryan is the new Chairman of the Board for Evergreen Rodeo. He has worked tirelessly behind the scenes to make the rodeo even more successful than in has been in the past. He leads an all-volunteer committee and is breathing new life into an Evergreen tradition.

LEADER OF THE YEAR NOMINEES

ELLEN O'CONNOR- EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR EVERGREEN PARK AND RECREATION DISTRICT

In 2018 Ellen led the EPRD board, staff and community members on a journey to go for a bond and mill levy to improve facilities for our community that in the end failed by just a few hundred votes. She started the year putting together with staff a needs assessment, costs, risks, options, requirements. She then facilitated multiple community meetings to get feed back both positive and negative to insure the best package possible was presented. Many times she had to go back to staff and price out options. Many times she had to meet with our community to answer questions, get feedback and re-present. Ellen did not do the work alone but she was a true leader in pulling people and information together to benefit our all ages. She always maintained a positive attitude. Even when the going got tough she would say "in my heart I just want to do what is right for this community today and in the future".

RABBI JAMIE ARNOLD- CONGREGATION BETH EVERGREEN

Rabbi Jamie has been very visible and involved in the Evergreen community. His passion for interfaith cooperation and dialogue is further evidenced by his leadership as vice president of The Interfaith Alliance of Colorado (TIA-CO) and in convening, and serving with, the local Evergreen Interfaith Group, the group responsible for starting AtHome, (an affordable housing initiative). Arnold also spearheaded the effort to create emergency shelter for Evergreen's homeless population. The Emergency Shelter Program is now an interfaith effort comprised of several churches that open their doors overnight when the temperature drops below 30 degrees. Rabbi Jamie also serves as a volunteer chaplain with the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department and is also the in-house song-leader and story teller at The Learning Center Preschool in Evergreen and has been playing his guitar and singing with their preschoolers for over 10 years.

MATTHEW CORMIER- PRINCIPAL AT WILMOT ELEMENTARY

The following programs have been implemented and/or fully supported by Matt through Wilmot: Community Garden built in partnership with EPRD, EAS+Y and Jeffco Schools; The Green Team, also in partnership with EAS+Y; many Health and Wellness Initiatives; Mountain Backpacks; recreational and childcare partnerships with EPRD; the Wetzel Family Foundation & Jefferson County for multi-use fields; supporter of growing the arts at EMS and EHS including the musicals and Astronomy Club.
