Thrill Kids with Science & Engineering – Volunteers Needed in November!

ACEC/MN is excited to have the opportunity to partner with <u>Science for Scientists</u> (SfS) for two days in November to get students excited about engineering! ACEC/MN's Workforce Development committee is partnering with SfS scientist instructors to bring an engaging hands-on engineering activity (Saving the Beach) to 4th- and 5th-grade students in Como Park Elementary School in St. Paul and Best Academy in Minneapolis.

In the Saving the Beach lesson, students examine the causes of beach erosion and discuss how erosion affects a beach and its 'stakeholders'. Students work in small groups (as Army Corps of Engineer staff) to engineer solutions to beach erosion through brainstorming, planning, and designing prototypes for their model beaches. All materials are provided by SfS.

To make this partnership successful we need volunteers! We need 2-3 volunteers for each of the following time slots. Each day has two time slots, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. SfS will provide training prior to making the presentation.
