

75TH SAILING SEASON BEGINS

The Ten Mile Lake sailing season officially begins Saturday, June 29, with a full line-up of beginner sailing clinics -- and races for more experienced sailors.

Our club began back in 1938, so we have a lot planned for our 75th year. On June 29th -- the beginning of the Fourth of July week -- we'll hold the tune-up race to get our sea legs back and to make sure our boats are rigged and tuned properly.

Then on Sunday (June 30), weather permitting, we'll hold the first in a series of informal sailing clinics in Sunfish sailboats beginning at 11 a.m. on the Moos dock. These classes are led by volunteers -- if you're interested, please email the <u>commodore</u> so we can secure enough instructors and boats. Clinics are also

scheduled for Sunday, **July 21**, and Sunday, **Aug. 4**.

For experienced sailors, our races begin at 1:30 p.m. Saturday. In case of foul weather, the races will be held at 10:30 a.m. Sunday.

Ki Hoffman won every regatta he entered in 2012 – the Fourth of July, Memorial Cup and the End of the Summer regattas.

Pete Roberts was nearly as efficient with second place finishes in the Fourth of July and Memorial Cup, and a third in the Moxness Cup.



But like the tortoise and the hare – by completing all four of our trophy races – Grant Moos won the Summer Series in 2012.

Pete finished second overall and Bob Crabb was third in the series.

It should also be noted that Mimi (Garbisch) Carlson, after a several-year hiatus, won the Moxness Cup, our most prestigious race of the season.

The 2012 season ended on an exciting note when we began the race in 17 mile-per-hour winds, only to have them build from there. The Crabb boat headed in for the day, leaving five boats at the starting line.

But just three finished: the Hoffmans in first, followed by Grant Moos and Geoff Cox. Pete Roberts and Andy Nelson both capsized. Many thanks to Jeff Manlove and Tom Brandt for their help in rescuing our fleet.
