At our season-ending gathering in 2010, six sailors were inducted into our inaugural Ten Mile Lake Sailing Club Hall of Fame. Dick Garbisch led the class, followed by Rollie Buck, Bob Buck, Jim Brandt and Jimmy Gamble. All were recognized for their roles in getting the club started in the 1930s.

And Dave Brandt, a long-time sailor, was also in the first class of Hall of Fame inductees. Dick Garbisch, who taught a series of sailing classes for young sailors in the 1960s and 1970s, is responsible for getting several of our current club members hooked on sailing.

Rollie Buck is the grandfather of past Commodore Tom Siqveland, and Jim Brandt is the father and grandfather of current members Tom (and Tom Jr.) Brandt.

More fresh air in the 2010 sailing season

The 2010 sailing season ended on a high note Aug. 7 when 10 boats showed up for the Moxness Cup – the most in about a decade.

The new (or sailors we haven't seen for awhile) boats included Harry Seward (with his wife, Judy, and Tara), Rebecca Lundberg and John Rainaldi (sailing the Putney boat) and Tom Garbisch sailing the old Garbisch wooden C, which performed well in the light air.

Ki and Byron Hoffman won both races to capture first overall, followed by Pete Roberts in second (with two thirds) and a tie for third: John and Rebecca (with a second and a fifth) and Bob Crabb and Robin (also with a second a fifth).

A complete lack of wind the following day on Sunday required us to cancel the End of the Summer race. But we were able to hold three of our four races this past season.

Pete Roberts and Bob Crabb tied for first in the Fourth of July Race, followed by Grant Moos and Byron Hoffman.

Ki Hoffman won the Memorial Cup with two firsts, Bob Crabb and Grant Moos tied for second with Mimi Garbisch Carlson in third.
