



2014 SAILING SEASON BEGINS

The 2014 Ten Mile Lake sailing season begins June 28 with several clinics for new sailors and races for more experienced ones.

On Saturday, June 28, we'll hold our annual tune-up race where we make sure we have our boats rigged properly and have located all of our gear from the year before.

The Fourth of July Regatta will be held Saturday, July 5, at 1:30 p.m. followed by the sailing season icebreaker party at about 4:30 p.m. at the Moos cabin. (Party starts when racing ends.)

Then, on Sunday, July 6 (weather permitting), we'll hold the first in a series of informal sailing clinics.

The classes -- taught by volunteers -- begin at 1:30 p.m. on the Moos dock. If you're interested, please email the [commodore](#) so we can line up instructors and boats. Clinics are also scheduled for Sunday, July 20, and Sunday, July 27. Everyone is welcome and there is no fee.

For the first time, on July 12, we'll hold an "All-comers race" where boats of different types will have an opportunity to race. Places will be determined by a handicapping system. This will give sailors who don't have C-boats an opportunity to fine-tune their skills.

On July 26, we'll hold the Moxness Cup Regatta -- traditionally the marquee race of the season -- followed by a sailing clinic the next day.

All races begin at 1:30 p.m. Saturday. In case of foul weather, the races will be held at 10:30 a.m. Sunday. The clinics will be held beginning at 1 p.m. on the Moos dock. If you have any questions, email the [commodore](#).

TML sailing community grows by one

One highlight of the 2013 sailing season was the reason for the “DNF” (did not finish) for Andy and Michelle Nelson in TM2 in the End of the Summer regatta.

“Oliver had to eat,” read the official notation as recorded by Rear Admiral Dick Staunton in the race committee boat. “Lowered sail after two legs.”

There was barely any wind for the race and Michelle could hear the cries of their newborn – 8-month-old Oliver Nelson – as they

approached the leeward mark, which just happened to be a couple hundred yards offshore from the Nelson-Cook cabin.

Some things are more important than sailing. And we're honored to note Oliver's arrival into this world and the Ten Mile sailing community.

The wind was so light that the second race was canceled. Ki and Byron Hoffman drifted into first place, followed by Grant Moos and Tommy Bliska in second, and Bob and Mariah Crabb in third.

In the Fourth of July regatta, the races were postponed until Sunday because of light wind. Grant Moos sailed to first in both races, with Geoff Cox and Bob Crabb each getting seconds and thirds, which tied them for second place overall in the regatta.

The Memorial Cup Regatta on July 20 was the most competitive race of the season with just a boat length separating the first three boats in both races. In the end, Grant Moos and Barry Topping sailed to first (a second and a first), followed by Ki and Byron Hoffman (a first and a third), and Pete Roberts and Rick Becher (a third and a second).

For the Moxness Cup on Aug. 3, there were barely any lead changes – with one remarkable exception: Geoff Cox sailed from almost last to first on the leeward leg of the second race. Unfortunately, he flipped on the reaching mark and did not finish. Ki and Byron Hoffman sailed to first in both races, followed by Grant Moos and Barry Topping in second in both races and Bob and Mariah Crabb in third in both races.

It should also be noted that Sara Olsen – with Emma and Amanda Olsen-Dufour and Stephanie Cox – also competed in both races, as did Mimi Garbisch.

For the season – by virtue of competing in every race – Grant Moos finished at the top of the summer series, followed by Ki Hoffman in second and Bob Crabb in third.
