

2017 SAILING SEASON BEGINS

The 2017 Ten Mile Lake sailing season begins with Fourth of July Race on July 1 followed by the Memorial Cup the next Saturday on July 8.

Having the races on back-to-back weekends gives us the best chance that people who come to the lake that week can participate in two races.

We'll do the same thing for the Moxness Cup and End of the Summer race. Those races will be on July 29 and Aug. 5 respectively.

There are two open weekend Saturdays on the schedule – July 15 and July 22 – that we'll reserve for make-up races and our ongoing sailing clinics, depending upon interest.

As usual, the first race begins at 1:30 p.m. In case of foul weather or no wind, the races will be held at 10:30 a.m. Sunday. If you have any questions, email the <u>commodore</u>.

Until then, get your boats tuned and we'll see you July 1.


TM 9 sails again

The remaining races were all won by Ki, with his father Byron as crew. That gave the Hoffman family enough points to win the Ten Mile Lake Summer Series trophy.

We hope to field more "next generation" races this summer where veteran skippers crew for our newer – generally younger – skippers.
