ACADEMY COURSES

Career Exploration — .5 High School Credits

Career Exploration is a course to help you learn about your options as you start thing about your future. What colleges are out there, what careers are out there and where you interest lie, and how you can put those interests into a successful career? The course will help open the world up to you. There are so many amazing careers in our world and so many outstanding post-secondary options to look at. This course will help you navigate through all the information that lies ahead of you.

Speech Communication — 1 High School Credit

This course is designed to introduce students to speech communication as it relates to three core areas: interpersonal communication, small group communication and public speaking. Through this introductory course, students will explore the fundamental theories of communication as well as identify and apply the basic skills from each of those three core areas.

Composition I — 1 High School Credit

The rhetorical strategies of description, narration, and exposition will be the focus of the course. Students will be expected to adhere to the basic writing process of brainstorming, outlining, drafting, and revision-- individual and peer and demonstrate their awareness of the following concepts in their reading and writing: thesis, audience, tone, unity, coherence, and emphasis. Grammar, spelling and complete sentence structure is an expectation in each writing assignment.

COMPLETION STANDARD

Students wishing to receive a certification must complete the all academy courses while maintaining at least a 'B' or better in each course. A 90% of better attendance rate in each course is also an expectation as well as meeting assignment deadlines 75% of the time.

CAREER EXPERIENCES

Students will explore and research careers with speakers, participate in business tours at a variety of industries as well as attending the Career Exploration Day event and other regional career fairs.
