



2019 Career Exploration Day Orientation

Career Exploration Day is an annual event of the **Bridges Career Academies & Workplace Connection** that showcases careers and career training programs through a fun environment with hands-on activities. This year's event will be **Friday, March 8, 2019** at Central Lakes College in Brainerd.

Important Facts

- **You will arrive and depart from CLC's campus at THE SAME DOOR.** Other schools are arriving and departing from different doors, so remember YOUR ENTRANCE DOOR. See bussing list included.

Departure times will be announced over the PA system.

- You may leave your coat and backpack on the bus, but should take with you anything valuable, such as a purse or phone. It's best to leave most everything at school in your locker, if you can. The entire event is inside, so there is no need for your coat or other things to keep track of.
- Either at your school or when you arrive at CLC, all students will be given a special **event bag** to hold onto any information or giveaways you may receive at the Career Exploration Day. The bag will also hold a pencil and that important map of the campus.
- The **map** you will be given is **color-coded**, with different colors matching different industry, or cluster areas. There will be volunteers holding color-coded signs at the entrance doors. Follow one of these people to the industry cluster area you wish to explore first, or ask them for directions.
- You will be at the event for several hours, so use your time wisely. We ask that you try to visit at least 3 different industry areas.
- **Lunch will be provided in the gym between 11 – 12:30. ONLY STUDENTS WITH RUBBER WRISTBANDS WILL BE ADMITTED TO LUNCH between 11-11:30 am.** These schools are the first to depart, so they will have the first opportunity to eat. You may eat ONLY in the gymnasium area. Please treat the CLC campus as you would your own school. Don't litter, and recycle what you can.
- You will be given a card with a QRcode and web link to access the NEW online **exit survey**. Students should complete this survey on your return bus ride. Please give complete, honest answers to make this event even better for future years.

Background Information on Bridges

The **Career Exploration Day** is just one of program of the **Bridges Career Academies & Workplace Connection** to better integrate work-based learning between schools and business.

Bridges strives to provide students career awareness, exploration and preparation to ensure a viable workforce. We provide leadership that engages and empowers students and educational professional to: explore career pathways, enhance partnerships between education and the business community, inspire innovative ideas, and promote regional career opportunities.

Bridges projects are divided into 3 main categories: career exposure, academic enrichment and career experiences.

Career Exposure

- *Career Exploration Day*: One-day event showcasing more than 150 regional high-demand careers with hands-on demonstrations, simulators, and breakout sessions.

Academic Enrichment

- *Career Academies*: Courses focused on career pathways, providing hands-on learning activities that combine technical, academic, and employability skills related to a specific career. Courses are delivered by high school instructors with support from industry representatives.
- *ProStart*: Industry-led hospitality pathway via [ProStart](#)

Career Experiences

- *Career Depot*: Website portal supporting career exploration and finding first job. Includes exclusive centralized database of entry-level style jobs for 18 years old and under.
- *Business tours*: Support/coordination/transportation for a 30-90 minute tour of a local business
- *Speakers in the classroom/industry videos* (video library): Local professional speaking on specific industry topic to classroom, or using pre-recorded videos and video resource guide

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
