



■ From the Desk of the Director

Recently Ames, IA was noted as the community with the lowest unemployment rate in the nation, an almost unfathomable 2.2%. NOTE: Boone County stands at 2.7%. (online readers can access more on our area's laborshed data here). Unemployment at or below 3% means nearly everyone who wants a job, has one. Sounds great, right? For the most part, yes. But there are two aspects of a low unemployment rate that a simple number doesn't necessarily address. One is "under"-employment. That is, working at a job below your skills and education, or working part-time when you'd prefer to work at a full-time job. Research shows that the underemployment number generally doubles the unemployment figures, leaving us with roughly 5% of the population not able to satisfactorily make ends meet in their current position. The other challenge with low unemployment is on the end of economic development. Industry prospects want to know who they'll be able to hire should they choose to locate their business in our county. In just the past week I shared a couple of conversations with chamber members lamenting the difficulty finding qualified workers. That's why workforce development has become the number one buzzword in our state. Programs through our local community colleges and industry trade associations aim to help to move people up in skills and knowledge to fill these higher paying positions. The state economic development office is working to attract workers from across the US to lowa with our low cost of living, low crime, and high quality of life. Most people agree that low unemployment is better than the staggering numbers of our last recession. But it comes with its own set of challenges that we continue work on each day.


