Bundling. Meal Deals. Volume Buying. These phrases aren't new to the business world. They have been used by the insurance, entertainment, fast food and bulk supplies industries for many years. The idea that you can get more for your dollar if you buy into pre-determined packages is one that has gained more traction in the last five years with Chambers of Commerce too.

We've watched these trends in the association industry at the same time we've watched the decline of what used to be called "the fair share" system of dues charged to members. The fair share system relied either on formulas for various segments of the business world (i.e. – banks paid on deposits, attorneys and doctors paid "professional" fees, hotels paid based on rooms, etc.) or FTE counts, that is, dues charged based on how many people a business employed.

The problem with these methods is they don't address the needs or wants of the member. Instead, they are solely a way to provide a measuring stick to justify fees for membership. In many ways they are fraught with inequities and penalize members for growing their businesses. Over the past two years the Chamber's Board of Directors has been investigating a new way to do business. One that would allow our members to decide what they want from their membership and how much they are willing to invest to get it. *If you haven't taken a moment already, please read my letter from late July providing a more thorough explanation of our new investment model.* Our new program will change the way you look at your membership, moving away from the somewhat foggy comprehension of our value proposition, to a more detailed understanding of exactly what benefits you should expect.

Over the next several months we'll provide more insights on how the program works, and ample opportunities to learn firsthand about this exciting new program for 2020 and beyond. We're preparing to put the power of choice in your hands and enter a new era in offering a truly "fair share" system.
