INTRODUCING WORK MONTCO

Baby Boomers are retiring from their jobs in the trades and manufacturing while younger workers have been looking for employment outside of these industries. It is anticipated that 31 million positions nationwide will be left vacant in 2020 due to these retirees. Work Montco was developed by the Community Youth Foundation (CYF), the 501c3 affiliate of The Chamber of Commerce for Greater Montgomery County to provide programs and activities that build essential life skills, and develop strong and vibrant youth who will contribute to our future workforce. Work Montco focuses on three pillars; literacy, employability skills and exploring potential career opportunities.

The Annual Community Reading Day promotes literacy

whereby nearly 120 volunteers from the business community take one morning to read to more than 2500 second grade students in Montgomery County. Readers also share what they do for a living to expose the students to different career option. The ongoing

different career option. The ongoing book drive collects and donates new and gently used books to families of children in need throughout the county to spark curiosity and a love of reading at an early age.

The Foundation connects local school districts with the business community to teach students about a wide variety of careers. The businesses offer students an opportunity to learn about career options through speakers, mentoring programs, volunteer positions, and scholarships to select career related summer camps.

In addition, the Foundation coordinates with the school districts to provide unique learning opportunities to high

school students and their families. Strengthening skills like resume writing, interview techniques, personal finance management, and healthy digital media habits allow Montgomery County youth to transition from academic success to employment success.

A program this fall entitled Career Choices: No B.S. will ex-

pose parents and students to career options that do not require a four-year degree. Speakers will share their path to success in several industries.



Early in 2020 a career camp fair will be presented providing families with sum-

mer options that allow students to have fun while learning about different career choices. One example of such a program is the Pennsylvania Free Enterprise, a "business camp" that allows rising juniors and seniors to experience a simulated company creation that includes judging and speaker programs. The CYF has provided scholarships for over 30 local students to attend PFEW.

The Foundation relies on donations from businesses and individuals to fund Work Montco. Currently children's books are being accepted for early readers to young adult. In addition, raffle tickets are available for purchase to win tickets to the December 9th Eagles vs Giants football game.






