This continues to be an exciting time for those interested in digital images and audio and visualization techniques. One very interesting project currently underway (and with which I am involved), is the MPEG 7 initiative, whose focus is on developing standards for the content coding of multimedia materials. The development of these standards will take several years, and we will be hearing quite a bit more about them as time goes on. Participants in the group are mainly from industry, with a few academic institutions represented. I am pleased therefore that LIS will now be represented at these important talks, which could have a major impact on the future of multimedia access. U.S. meetings are open to anyone; if you have a particular interest in this area, you may wish to attend.

An interesting note is that the original call for proposals for these standards was expected to result in about 100 submissions; more than 600 were received. I had a chance to preview several in Albuquerque and San Jose, and the ones I heard about were *vastly* different from each other. It looks like the issues of metadata and indexing for multimedia materials are still very fluid, and we are definitely in for some interesting times!
