

Washington County K-12

Washington County consists of seven school districts, four private schools, and four colleges and vocational training schools.

Belpre City Schools Belpre City Schools serve Belpre and the surrounding area with a reputation for strong academics. Belpre Schools received an "Effective" rating from the Ohio Department of Education based upon student achievement tests. The graduation rate is 88%. The attendance rate is 96%. Approximately 76% of Belpre High School students pursue higher education upon graduation.

Fort Frye High School Fort Frye High School (FFHS) has a proud tradition of academic and athletic achievement. FFHS offers advanced placement courses in English Literature, English Language, and Calculus. The advanced mathematics track begins in 8th grade. Activities at FFHS include: Science Olympiad (junior and senior high school), Mock Trial team, National Honor Society, FCCLA, FFA, Spanish Honor Society, International Thespian Society, golf, football, volleyball, basketball, track, baseball, and softball. The J. Bryan and Norma R. McCann Scholarship Endowment supports graduating seniors as they pursue higher education. Nearly three-quarters of all graduating seniors pursue four year or two year college degrees. The graduation rate is 93%. The attendance rate is 95%.

Frontier Local School District Frontier Local School District is located in New Matamoras. The district includes four schools that serves around 800 students in preschool through 12th grade. With three local elementary schools, one high school, there is 17 students for every full time equivalent teacher. The District has a graduation rate of 90% and an attendance rate of 97%. The High School has been awarded the State sponsored Ohio School of Promise Award for the past three consecutive years. A variety of organizations are also available for students to join including drama club, choir and key club. Athletic programs also play an important role in the development of our students and most major sports are offered to both boys and girls. We are very proud of our School District and our Community. We at Frontier Local School District strive to offer our students a first rate education necessary to be successful in the 21st century, all the while cherishing our small town rural traditions.

Marietta City Schools The district serves about 3,000 students and families with four elementary schools, one middle school and one high school and serves the communities of Marietta, Reno, Devola, Harmar, and Oak Grove. Marietta High School (MHS) offers an extensive advanced placement and honors level selection of courses in a broad curriculum, along with many college preparatory and general education class offerings. Marietta High School is accredited by the state of Ohio Department of Education. Competitive interscholastic athletics, an award winning marching band a wide variety of extracurricular programs afford students the opportunities for personal growth. Marietta High School will be starting an Engineering Program in conjunction with Washington State Community College (WSCC) next year called "Project Lead The Way." MHS is also working on another collaborative project with WSCC to enhance the current Channel 22 (public access channel). Over two-thirds of graduating seniors plan to

attend four-year or two-year colleges. The attendance rate is 95% and the graduation rate is 88.9% (2013-2014 school year).

[Warren Local Schools](#) Warren Local School District serves western Washington County. Warren Local received a “B” on the performance index. Warren High School offers advanced placement classes in six subjects as well as advanced placement classes online. Honors classes are also offered. Some clubs at Warren High School include: Ballroom Dancing, Computer/Digital Art, Forensics, Key Club, National Honor Society, Physics in the Park, and Science Olympiad. Sports include cheerleading, cross country, football, golf, soccer, volleyball, basketball, wrestling, baseball, softball and track. Music groups include: a cappella, bass chorus, bells, concert band, jazz band, marching band, and treble chorus. The graduation rate was 89% and the attendance rate was 95% (2013-2014 school year).

[Wolf Creek Local School District](#) Located in Waterford, it serves around 700 students. There are two school buildings: Waterford Elementary School for grades K-8, and Waterford High School for grades 9-12. The district earned a “B” on the performance index. In the past five years there has been a 100% graduation rate. There are also multiple extracurricular activities offered to students including, band, theater, and yearbook. Students are also able to participate in sports such as golf, baseball, volleyball, track, softball and baseball.
