Spotlight on Excellence:

Mission Hospice Society builds community through compassionate care, local generosity

Since 1985 Mission Hospice Society (MHS) has provided compassionate endof-life care and support in a manner that truly embodies the key components of community building.

"If you don't have a compassionate community, you don't have much of one. Ensuring that exists is all about community building," said Angel Elias, MHS executive director who is humbled by the fact the non-profit is recipient of the 2017 Mission Regional Chamber of Commerce Community Builder Business Excellence Award.

MHS, has a team of about 100 active volunteers in our community assisting with its Bereavement and Palliative support services, in local homes, at Christine Morrison Hospice (at Mission Memorial Hospital) and in acute care and in its resource center on Hillcrest Avenue in Mission.

MHS is proud to offer children and teens bereavement support groups which are currently taking place at Heritage Park and Hatzic middle school. MHS also provides a Circle of Friends children's grief support group at the Hospice House on Tuesdays. For more details on MHS children's and teens programs including its camps please call the office.

On April 28, MHS hosts its biggest fundraiser of the year, the Wild Wild West gala, with The Rock family as presenting sponsor. "Without this gala we couldn't provide the support that we do," said Elias, adding that the event funds MHS palliative and bereavement support programs.

"The community really support programs," "The community really supports everything we do. We are active in Mission and are part of many leadership teams. With have a great relationship with Fraser Health and this helps build a better community," she said. MHS funds all the non-medical "comfort measures" at Christine Morrison Hospice, offers a caregivers support group on Tuesdays, evening adult support groups, and Compassionate Friends, a third party organization providing support for bereaved parents — all free to the community.

Its annual Hike for Hospice event, April 8 this year, supports MHS palliative programs. The annual Motorcycle Ride for Hospice is Aug. 12 and helps to fund the MHS Children's Camp at Zajac Ranch.

"We are always looking for volunteers, contact us at our office (604-826-2235)," said Elias. MHS annual general meeting is March 21.
